

Allamanda is a medium-sized, evergreen vine or shrub. Native to Brazil, the Allamanda vine has large, glossy, dark-green leaves arranged in whorls of 3 or 4, and boasts large yellow or mauve, trumpet-shaped flowers. Overall height may reach 10 feet if supported by a trellis or fence. The Allamanda shrub has smaller leaves with smaller tube-shaped, yellow flowers and may reach an overall height of 3 to 4 feet. Its growth habit is much more dense and compact than that of the Allamanda vine. Both the Allamanda vine and shrub are considered tropical and can be damaged by frosts and freezing temperatures; however, new growth will emerge in the spring from plants which have suffered cold-damage.

PLANTING

Best growth can be expected when plants are set in a well-drained, improved soil in sun or partial shade. Mix Bio-tone starter into the soil at the time of planting for fast healthy root growth. *See our guides on planting and establishing for detailed instructions.*

FERTILIZING

Apply **Espoma Plant-Tone** several times during the growing season according to the package directions.

PLANT PROBLEMS

Scale Insects, Aphids and Mealy Bugs can be controlled with **Insecticidal Soap**, **All Seasons Oil** or **Organicide** oil spray.
